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this anthology is remarkable not only for the selections themselves among which the schelling and the heidegger essays were translated especially for this volume but also for the editors general introduction and the introductory essays for each selection which make this volume an invaluable aid to the study of the powerful recurrent ideas concerning art beauty critical method and the nature of representation because this collection makes clear the ways in which the philosophy of art relates to and is part of general philosophical positions it will be an essential sourcebook to students of philosophy art history and literary criticism

this is a sweeping and provocative work of aesthetic theory a trenchant critique of the philosophy of art as it developed from the eighteenth century to the early twentieth century combined with a carefully reasoned plea for a new and more flexible approach to art jean marie schaeffer one of france s leading aestheticians explores the writings of kant schlegel novalis hegel schopenhauer nietzsche and heidegger to show that these diverse thinkers shared a common approach to art which he calls the speculative theory according to this theory art offers a special kind of intuitive quasi mystical knowledge radically different from the rational knowledge acquired by science this view encouraged theorists to consider artistic geniuses the high priests of humanity creators of works that reveal the invisible essence of the world philosophers came to regard inexpressibility as the aim of art refused to consider second tier creations genuine art and helped to create conditions in which the genius was expected to shock puzzle and mystify the public schaeffer shows that this speculative theory helped give birth to romanticism modernism and the avant garde and paved the way for an unfortunate divorce between art and enjoyment between high art and popular art and between artists and their public rejecting the speculative approach schaeffer concludes by defending a more tolerant theory of art that gives pleasure its due includes popular art tolerates less successful works and accounts for personal tastes a remarkable work schaeffer s writing is governed by the ideals of clarity and consequence the ideas of logic truth and evidence schaeffer is so precise and unrelenting a philosophical critic that one wonders how some of the philosophies he anatomizes here can possibly survive the operation from the foreword by arthur c danto

the first book to explore the role of images in philosophical thought and teaching in the early modern period delving into the intersections between artistic images and philosophical knowledge in europe from the late sixteenth to the early eighteenth centuries the art of philosophy shows that the making and study of visual art functioned as important methods of philosophical thinking and instruction from frontispieces of books to monumental prints created by philosophers in collaboration with renowned artists susanna berger examines visual representations of philosophy and overturns prevailing assumptions about the limited function of the visual in european intellectual history rather than merely illustrating already existing philosophical concepts visual images generated new knowledge for both aristotelian thinkers and anti aristotelians such as descartes and hobbes printmaking and drawing played a decisive role in discoveries that led to a move away from the authority of aristotle in the seventeenth century berger interprets visual art from printed books student lecture notebooks alba amicorum friendship albums broadsides and paintings and examines the work of such artists as pietro testa léonard gaultier abraham bosse dürer and rembrandt in particular she focuses on the rise and decline of the plural image a genre that was popular among early modern philosophers plural images brought multiple images together on the same page often in order to visualize systems of logic metaphysics natural philosophy or moral philosophy featuring previously unpublished prints and drawings from the early modern period and lavish gatefolds the art of philosophy reveals the essential connections between visual commentary and philosophical thought

fourteen prominent analytic philosophers engage with the philosophical puzzles raised by conceptual art what kind of art is conceptual art what follows from the fact that conceptual art does not aim to have aesthetic value what knowledge or understanding can we gain from conceptual art how ought we to appreciate conceptual art

jerzy perzanowski s ideas were based on an original blend of logic and ontology in what he called onto logic where the slash is meant to suggest a quotient of ontology by logic perzanowski began as a logician his early works being on modal logic then gradually shifted his interest to logical philosophy meaning not so much philosophy of logic as philosophy informed by logic perzanowski was a rare breed of analytical philosopher who thought that a philosophical theory of everything was worthwhile in this systematic spirit he began with method he presented his method of total analysis and synthesis quite simply reduce the object of research to its simplest possible constituents and then combine them in some way better still combine them in every possible way thereby producing a space of possibilities analogous to and in certain cases identical with the logical space thus analysis and synthesis differ from a trivial disassembly and reassembly

although creativity from plato onwards has been recognized as a topic in philosophy it has been overshadowed by investigations of the meanings and values of works of art in this collection of essays a distinguished roster of philosophers of art redress this trend the subjects discussed include the nature of creativity and the process of artistic creation the role that creative making should play in our understanding and evaluation of art relations between concepts of creation and creativity and ideas of tradition metaphor genius imagination and genre this is an important collection that will be eagerly sought by philosophers of art as well as theorists in art history cinema studies and literary criticism

this volume is dedicated to the socio political role of art and aesthetics as well as the specific relationship between philosophy and literature some of the issues discussed here relate to the ideological use and or abuse of art and the question of whether art should be engaged or disengaged these questions in turn lead to the need for a more precise philosophical or aesthetic definition of art and thus to a renewed clarification of the relationship between art and religion on the one hand and between literature and philosophy on the other

examining the stoic conception of philosophy as an art of living with particular emphasis on the relationship between theoretical discourse and practical training sellars outlines the socratic background to this conception of philosophy and assesses ancient objections to it especial attention is paid to the relationship between discourse logos and training askesis in the works of epictetus and marcus aurelius the wider philosophical significance of this conception of philosophy is also addressed and in particular its implications for understanding the relationship between philosophy and biography

questions about historical thinking it enquires what scientific history of art can accomplish what are its mean and limitations it contains philosophical reflections on history and begins with chapters on the scope and limitations of a sociology of art and the concept of ideology in the history of art the chapter on the concept of art history without names occupies the central position in the book thoroughly discussing the basic philosophical outlook for the whole work there are also further chapters on psychoanalysis folk art and popular art the chapter on the role of convention in the history of art points the way for further study

applying contemporary pragmatism to the crucial question of how philosophy can help us live better shusterman develops his distinctive aesthetic model of philosophical living that includes politics somatics and ethnicity while critically engaging the rival views of dewey wittgenstein and foucault as well as rorty putnam goodman habermas and cavell

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
